

This is a humorous board book that plays a geometric game with little readers – revealing a world of shifting vertical and horizontal perspectives.

The story uses imagery from the everyday life of kids, parents and pets to weave together a comedic tale of vertical activities – such as walking to work – and horizontal ones – lying down after a tough day, perhaps. A stroll with the dog is transformed when everything goes vertical after the dog spots a cat and a swift chase ensues. To follow the story, the reader keeps turning the book up and down, right and left.

The style of illustration is bold and creative, with human and animal figures stretching across the page in every direction. On every page, readers can attempt to guess what might come next, sparking their imagination and sensory experience. The book's uncanny approach to geometry and perspective won it a distinction in the Jasnowidze competition for children's book illustration.

This canine counting book is full of peppy illustrations and unexpected rhymes that deftly engage the reader in a playful approach to learning.

Dashing dogs are at the very heart of this story — with its high-spirited greyhounds who play hide-and-seek across its pages, punctuated by simple counting rhymes. It is an imaginative dog-walk through digits and number concepts, full of wordplay and striking visual cues. The rhymes are short and to the point, each one the cusp of a whole new story that can be developed in the early

reader's own imagination. The story invites young readers to discover the ideas that lie between a smattering of words to create a whole world of stories. The basic colour scheme coupled with a dynamic illustration style sharpen the reader's focus on the image at hand, sparking their imagination to come up with what might happen next.

This charming board book offers a generous store of meanings in just a few words. Full of wordplay and riddles, it encourages little readers to engage in active family reading.

It's ideal for infants and young children who can start sounding out the words on the page and identifying the parts of the body. The effect is a sort of hide-and-seek game, where children point out the answer to the following questions: 'Where are the kitty's ears? Where are the dog's spots? Where are the mouse's teeth? Where are the mole's paws?' The answers are hidden behind a flap. All in all, there are twelve different animals, from house pets to more

exotic creatures like the anteater and the narwhal. At the end of the book, the reader can point out all the features of a child's face, including a pair of ears hidden under earmuffs – revealed by lifting the flaps. This interactive picture book helps develop a child's focus, visual perception and vocabulary, while fostering an interactive approach to reading and discovering the world.



The members of this illustrated orchestra play 'alliterative' instruments, creating an imaginative word-play that runs through the pages of the story. The musical sound of each word draws the reader into an onomatopoeic game of sounds and learning. This whimsical approach encourages young readers to mimic stimulating sounds and even to reach for some of the instruments highlighted in the bold illustrations: cymbals and drums or really any music-making object we might find on hand. This book also encourages young people to recognise the audio-sphere around us – all the sounds we hear on an everyday basis. It also introduces a valuable store of vocabulary set up around musical education

and musicians. The simplicity and musicality of the succinct sentences make it easy for young readers to repeat and remember novel concepts – and even to improve their diction, as a speech exercise of sorts. The illustration style is eye-catching, based on bold black outlines that create scenes of dramatic musical flair, full of contrasting colours and set against a white background. The effect is a playful, joyful and dynamic musical adventure that can be stretched like an accordion thanks to its child-friendly format. A wonderful way to engage young readers in early musical education through poetry and play!



Through the dog hero of the story, young readers learn about the natural processes of observing the world around us and analysing its minute details. This book takes an in-depth approach to relaying these concepts through the playful story of a canine painter named Van Dog, who goes on a stroll through the countryside. His plan is to quietly contemplate his surroundings, but the natural world around him begins to come alive and interact with the artist, giving its own rather strong opinions on painting. Van Dog doesn't get the peace and quiet he's looking for – instead he discovers a complex and colourful ecosystem that is constantly in motion. He meets the challenge and continues to explore

his surroundings and engage with those he meets on his way. The illustrations are full of eye-catching details that enchant the reader and inspire his or her own ideas and assumptions about the story – and the world beyond the book as well. Overall, this story is meant to encourage young people to devote closer attention to what's going on around them, to reach down and take a peek at what's beneath a leaf, to listen to the birds singing... to take more notice of what's around us, because even the most obvious things just around the corner can still amaze and astonish.

The action takes place in the castle of King Bolebor and Queen Drogomira. Author and illustrator Nikola Kucharska invites the reader to explore every corner of this multifaceted castle through all the months of the year, day in and day out. It is composed of thirteen spreads (or chapters), starting with a presentation of all the characters, followed by elaborate spreads that feature each of the characters engaged in their own lives and stories which develop further with each turn of the page. Every spread is also a complete scene in itself, full of charming details that spark

plenty of associations and ideas everything from secret chambers, mysterious machines, playful elves, spooky ghosts and flying dragons to a terrifying Dark Wolf. These charming and detailed illustrations draw young readers into the story and the actions and emotions of the characters – joy and excitement, danger and fear, fear and sadness, strength and bravery - through contact with the familiar and the astonishing. This book is the latest in the popular series that follows a single theme through all twelve months of the year.



He is the recipient of a number of awards and his books have been translated into French, Turkish, Chinese and Slovak. His work, including 'Happy Mug', has also been adapted for the stage (2020).



Agnieszka Żelewska

An illustrator of textbooks and children's books with over a dozen publications to her name. She has received two illustration awards from the Polish Section of IBBY.

In the eighth book of his popular series, Happy Mug learns new things each day, together with his mother, father and his turtle named Plushie. Each story is only about five minutes long to read out loud, making it ideal for the smallest readers. Happy Mug goes through a range of emotions that people tend to experience every day – joy and sadness, encountering both pleasant and unfortunate surprises. Each story ends with a discovery that helps Happy Mug learn a new lesson. For instance, he finds out that watching the stars at night

can help you fall asleep, that some things can be large and small at the same time, that there are things in the world that can be shared without ever running out, and that the best thing about making plans is spending that time together! The book offers a subtle approach to philosophical questions and the discovery of the world around us, punctuated by sweet, endearing illustrations.







They are particularly aimed at children who are just beginning to socialise and form relationships with their peers. The authors approach these complex topics in a way that is appealing to children, delving into the nature of joy and self-acceptance. The book considers human values that are integral to our lives

– but which are sometimes hard to nurture in the modern world. In *Something and Nothing*, the authors confront the importance of self-acceptance in the face of outside judgement, showing how much influence the opinions of others can have on us – even when they're entirely off the mark.





They help children understand the importance of shielding themselves from the negative effects of outside judgement. The next book in the series, *Yesterday and Today* is a lightly philosophical treatment of the meaning of the past and future. It asks readers to consider the relative importance of memories, past

experiences and nostalgia in contrast to hope, plans and change. It inspires readers to set themselves in the 'here and now' and offers a wonderful lesson in finding joy in the world and spotting happiness even when it isn't obvious at first glance.



In this mystery for young readers, a mother bear named Turi is searching for a safe place to raise her playful cubs Bertie and Orson.

They arrive in the woods, only to sense the dangerous scent of human beings all around. Strange things are happening in these woods – with traps and holes set up throughout. These discoveries not only worry the mother bear, but the deer, boar and ravens who live there too. The local postman shares their concerns, and the mystery sparks his detective instincts, leading him to investigate exactly what's going on in these woods. A seemingly straightforward mystery is turned upside down, with an astonishing conclusion. In the meantime, the bear family encounters a truly dangerous situation... As young readers follow the trail of

mystery through the woods, they learn a great deal about animals and their habits and habitats: for instance, how adult bears discipline their young, how they find a safe place to raise them and what role the father bear plays in their lives. Most importantly, the book confronts readers with a vital question: how can humans and bears live peacefully side by side? This wise and faithfully illustrated story is the third in a series by this author-illustrator duet, following their previous tales of wolves and badgers in the wild.



The story is centred around the residents of a town stumped by the robbery of artworks from one home after another. The narrative is supplemented with a series of clues, riddles, diagrams, maps and activities that help the reader on the way to figuring out the mystery. The accompanying QR codes immerse the reader even further into the world of the story. The main character, Agent Lola, is a slick detective who is well-versed in the nuances of human behaviour and adept at

drawing details and clues from potential witnesses to find the location of these works of art. These stolen pieces in the story are actually world-class works that can be found in the museums of the world – and are accessible via the Web. As the reader solves the mystery alongside Agent Lola, they build a sense of confidence in their critical thinking and problem-solving skills, while having a great deal of fun at the same time.

This enchanting tale brings fantasy, humour and intrigue together in an illustrated mystery novel for young readers. It draws upon the mythical figure known as a 'Stolem', which originates from the Kashubia district of Pomerania in Poland.



Stolko the Stolem is the hero of this story – a large creature covered in thick fur, with sharp and pointy teeth and nails. He loves stormy days when the rain pours and the wind rushes through the air, and he enjoys rolling about in all the puddles and mud. He only leaves his cave-home at night because, according to legend, the sun would turn him to stone.




He lives with his family: mother, father and grandmother in a loving home where he enjoys delicious snacks like earthworms in toadstool sauce – but still, Stolko feels bored. He'd like to have friends and explore the world beyond his cave.

One night, he sneaks out to the forest and meets a little girl... and that encounter is the beginning of a great adventure full of intrigue. Stolko and his friend form a bond that even their differences can't break – demonstrating that courage, loyalty and friendship are more important than appearances or the judgements of others. The book has received a great deal of acclaim and the first prize (6-10 age category) in the fifth edition of the Astrid Lindgren competition for contemporary books for children and young adults organised by the ABCXXI Foundation.

As the director of the Tatra National Park, co-author Paweł Skawiński is fully equipped to share his wisdom about the region in a kid-friendly way.







It tells the story of a young boy who desperately wants to save his sister from an illness. He embarks on a voyage to find a golden apple that is supposed to save her. Along the way, he must tackle the River of Sadness, the Forest of Fury and the Abyss of Despair. He must also deal with the emotions that come up: rage, anger, fear, joy and helplessness. His sister also has a special gift: weaving. She is able to weave a golden cloud of light and a bridge out of moonlight to help her brother get through the harshest moments of his travels. Strengthened by the golden apple that he victoriously brings back to her, she reveals her secret: she wants to weave a garment for the entire sky, filling it with clouds of every colour. Once her brother is safe, she goes off to the Palace of the Sun to fulfil her dreams. Katarzyna Jackowska-Enemuo wrote this book after the death of her daughter as a means of helping others work through the painful loss of a loved one. It shows how adults can help young people work through trauma and

better understand their emotions in such situations, while nurturing their sense of security in the face of uncertainty and fear. Marianna Sztyma's dreamy illustrations heighten the author's gentle and universal approach to this complex topic.


This is the third book in Ola Woldańska-Płocińska's non-fiction nature series, following Beastocracy and Trashopolis. This time she has devoted her humorous style of sharing facts and figures with kids to the subject of food and nutrition. The book begins with a historical perspective on what people used to eat in prehistoric times and the lengths they would go to in order to secure food for their communities. The cultural aspects of eating and feasting are a pillar of this project, including explanations on why people eat certain foods in certain places, why religions allow or forbid certain foods, what it means to fast, and how our culinary customs help us bond with other members in our family and community. A good chunk of the book is devoted to nutrition and the importance of a balanced diet. More complex topics are also covered, such as hunger, malnutrition and food waste. The writing style is perfectly suited to a young reader and delivers a great deal of information in an entertaining burst of prose, punctuated with a brilliant illustration style that works up a hunger for a good meal... and lovely books.







He gets wrapped up in a political conspiracy and war... suddenly, the action of the story is interrupted, and the reader is transported fifty years into the future. We meet Irena, a resolute twelve-year-old girl who is the daughter of a local art conservator responsible for restoring the frescos in the local library. One day the girl hears whispers coming from below the floorboards in the

library and this leads her to the discovery of the city's secrets – and the story of Tobias and Elizabeth. She embarks on a treasure hunt that provides answers to all the mysteries arising at the start of the book – revealing, for instance, the nature of the monster living below Lapis and the reason why there is a lighthouse in a city with no sea. The subtle illustrations are the perfect complement to this suspenseful tale of mystery.

The main characters of the story are a pair of twelve-year-old boys. One of them, Peter, is visually impaired and his disability impacts the way he interacts with his peers, who tease and even bully him. In one aggressive situation, the roles are reversed, with Peter regaining his sight while the bully Eryk begins to lose his own. He then becomes dependent on the boy he had been bullying all along. The fact that this is happening while an endless war is taking place complicates the story further. No one in the town can remember what they are fighting about or what their ultimate goal is. This absurd and dangerous environment pushes children to confront


and weigh their emotions, their relations with others, their habits and inclinations in the face of the threats that the war holds for their lives. Childish acts of aggression are transferred into the greater realm of all-out war, with small battles reflecting the broader national and international crises. The overall message of the book is to highlight humanity's enduring quest for peace in the presence of cruelty and aggression. The book encourages readers to take a critical look at how our individual behaviour impacts the world through the metaphor of what happens at House Number five.





Step by step, Adele learns about the stages of her illness and the steps she will take to

get better. Her elderly companion in the book gives her support and the strength to fight against the illness. The book also reveals the bonds children form with other young patients in the hospital ward, finding ways to laugh and have fun, even though there are sad moments along the way. This valuable book helps people of all ages to break the taboos of illness and to better understand the emotions surrounding sickness and the struggle to get better. All proceeds from the book are donated to cancer patients and their families.





SMALL BOOK GREAT PERSON





The Polish Book Institute's Small Book – Great Person campaign reminds us of the benefits of reading together as a family, right from the first months of a child's life.

It has been devised to complement the bookstart programme, in which young parents are presented with a reading layette while still in the maternity ward.



We believe that reading begins from the cradle, long before children begin to independently put letters together. Well-chosen books develop their minds and emotions, shape their linguistic competence, root them in culture and stimulate their imagination. The reading layette consists of a selection of poems for children called Mom. Dad and Me (Mama, tata i ja) by celebrated Polish poets, beautifully illustrated by Elżbieta Wasiuczyńska, as well as a brochure entitled Connected by the Books I Read to my Child from Birth, which shows parents the incalculably important role that reading plays in a child's development. Our aim is to convince parents that reading together can be not just a great pleasure, but above all a wonderful opportunity to build intimacy and strong, lasting family connections.



The next step of our campaign is dedicated to children about to begin their pre-school education (3-6 years old). Its aim is to encourage parents to visit libraries frequently and read with their children on a daily basis. Every child who comes to a library participating in the project receives, as a gift, a reading layette, which includes the book *My First Reading Book (Pierwsze czytanki dla...)*

illustrated by the outstanding artist Józef Wilkoń, and a Little Reader's Card. Each time the little reader visits the library and borrows at least one book from the children's collection, they receive a sticker. After collecting ten of these, they are presented with a personalised certificate in confirmation of their reading accomplishments. Pre-schoolers can borrow books from more than 6,600 libraries across the country.



The third stage of our bookstart project is targeted at children starting primary school. Since 2020, every pupil beginning first grade has received a book containing a selection of the best classic texts by Polish authors for this age group, illustrated by Iwona Chmielewska, an artist appreciated the world over. My First ABC (Pierwsze abecadto) is our invitation to children to learn to read independently.

Thus far, more than 3,000,000 reading layettes for new-borns, pre-schoolers and pupils have been distributed under the programme.







The Small Book – Great Person campain also has a 'social' element whereby it is present on television, radio and the Internet, and organises many live events for children and parents, with an annual reach of twenty million Poles.



The Small Book – Great Person initiative is funded by the Ministry of Culture, National Heritage and Sport of the Republic of Poland as part of the National Programme of Reading Development.





POLISH BOOK INSTITUTE







The Polish Book Institute is a national institution established by the Polish Ministry of Culture. It has been open in Kraków since January 2004. The Institute's basic aims are to influence the reading public and to popularise books and reading within Poland, as well as to promote Polish literature worldwide. These goals are accomplished through:

- the promotion of the best Polish books and their authors;
- the organisation of working visits and residencies for translators and foreign publishers;
- increasing the number of translations from Polish into foreign languages with the help of the ©POLAND Translation Programme and Sample Translations ©POLAND;
- making information on Polish books and the Polish publishing market accessible to foreign consumers.

The Institute promotes Polish books by organising literary programmes at international book fairs, appearances by Polish writers at literary festivals, and participating in many other programmes designed to promote Polish culture worldwide. Besides its annual catalogue, New Books from Poland, the Polish Book Institute also publishes cultural journals dealing with literature and theatre (Akcent, Dialog, Literatura na świecie, Nowe Książki Odra, Teatr, Teatr Lalek, and Twórczość).


Book Institute provides financial support for publishers aiming to publish works of Polish literature in foreign-language translations. Since 1999, the ©POLAND Translation Programme has provided almost 3,000 grants for translations into 50 different languages published in 63 countries. The average grant is worth approximately $\[\in \]$ 3,500. The Book Institute can help cover the costs of publishing the following types of works:

- literature: prose, poetry, and drama
- works in the humanities, broadly conceived, whether classical or contemporary (with particular regard for books devoted to the culture and literature of Poland)
- non-fiction (literary reportage, biography, memoirs, essays)
- historical works (essays and popular history, barring specialist and academic works)
- literature for children and young people
- comics

The financial contribution of the Book Institute is designed to support the following publication costs:

- translation
- copyright licensing
- printing

SAMPLE TRANSLATIONS ©POLAND

The aim of this programme is to encourage translators to present Polish books to foreign publishers. Grants under the programme cover up to 20 pages of translation. The translator must have published a minimum of one translation in book form before submitting an application. THE TRANSATLANTYK PRIZE

It has been awarded annually by the Book Institute since 2005 to outstanding ambassadors of Polish literature abroad. It provides a focal point for translators of Polish literature and its promoters (publishers, literary critics, academics and organisers of cultural events). The prize is worth € 10,000.

THE FOUND IN TRANSLATION AWARD

The prize is given to the translator(s) of the finest book-length translation of Polish literature into English published in the previous calendar year. The winner receives a prize of 16,000 zlotys and a one-month residency in Kraków. The Book Institute has presented this award in partnership with the Polish Cultural Institutes in London and New York on an annual basis since 2008.







THE TRANSLATORS' COLLEGIUM

Based at a new building on the grounds of the Book Institute in Kraków. This programme provides working residencies for translators of Polish literature. During their residency, the translators are provided with suitable conditions for their work and assistance with their translations. The college has been active since 2006. By 2021, some 120 translators from 38 countries have taken part in the programme.

THE WORLD CONGRESS OF TRANSLATORS OF POLISH LITERATURE

It has been organized every four years since 2005, gathers around two hundred and fifty translators from all over the world. Meetings are arranged with writers, critics and academics. The Congress provides an opportunity to find out more about Polish literature, to meet colleagues from other countries and to exchange information, ideas and opinions.

SEMINARS FOR FOREIGN PUBLISHERS

Since 2006, the Book Institute has invited groups of publishers from various countries to Kraków to show them what Polish literature has to offer. During the study visit they attend meetings with writers, publishers, and critics.
